President's Message

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I asked Alan Moodie, a Life Member of SPS and long-time Print Coordinator, to tell us about his history as a photographer and member of SPS. Here is his response:

When I was a kid, my mom used to have a temporary darkroom set up in our bathroom and she would print her black-and-white negatives. She would print 5 x 7 prints of us kids and of photos that she took on our vacations. This is what got me interested in having my own darkroom later on.



My mom was an excellent gardener and loved to grow rhododendrons and rock garden type plants. She got herself a Nikon SLR in the 6os and loved to take slides of her rhododendron and rock garden flowers. I would borrow her Nikon and take photos myself. Later in college I loved to go hiking with several friends and we all had cameras for taking photos of the scenery. I had a Canon SLR back then and I still own Canon equipment.

I have always wanted to print my own images and I have had a black-and-white and color darkroom since the early 70s. I printed black-and-white negatives and color slides. I shot mostly color slides rather than color negatives, so I usually printed direct positive color paper (Kodak

Ektachrome paper) and developed it in my darkroom. I usually printed 16 x 20 size prints. I originally developed my prints in trays, then in a color canoe, and finally in a Jobo tubular processor. Nowadays I am all digital and print my images on an Epson 4880 Color printer.

My favorite type of photography is landscape photography. Shooting landscape photography started for me when I was in college and I still enjoy it today. I also enjoy macro photography and early on I had a macro lens and bellows system for my film cameras. I have a macro lens for my current digital equipment. Other types of photography I enjoy are architectural photography and abstracts.



I joined SPS in November 1974. I was told about Seattle photographic Society by my great aunt. She traveled a lot and had belonged to SPS several years earlier to learn how to use her camera better. She thought I would be very

interested in the kind of work that SPS photographers were doing then. I went several meetings, liked what I saw and joined.



In 1975 SPS presented Foto Folio, a print competition of photographers' portfolios. You needed to enter ten prints of your work, which would be judged as a whole and hung together. We received entries from across the United States and across Europe. The exhibit was hung at the Seattle Center for a month. Judy Walters and Roy Richards were the originators of the idea, and I helped along with other SPS members to gather prints, make posters and hang the show. We also sat with the show for an entire month to answer questions from the visitors. The show was a success and we did a

second Foto Folio in 1976 at the Seattle Center.

I became print director at SPS in July 1976. I was print director for a year to June 1977 at which time I was elected president for a two-year term from July 1977 to June 1979. When I was president Grace Lanctot was vice president, Eugene Collias was the secretary and Florence Schenk was treasurer.

I became print director again in July 1980 through June of 1985. I then was elected print director for a third time in July 1994 to the present.

I was involved in organizing the 1989 Seattle library print show. SPS members entered their best prints to be put on display at the downtown Seattle library. We displayed hundreds of prints on Velcro panels for the public to enjoy.

I designed and built the print racks that we use at SPS and the scoring machine we use every month. That machine is over 30 years old and still keeps working with the help of a little TLC by myself and others.



I served on the board of the Northwest Council of camera clubs from 1983 to 2005. I was the NWCCC Newsletter editor from 1998 to 2004. I have either been the Print director or the assistant print director from 1987 to the present. Currently, I assist Sam Ruljancich in the Open

and Traveling print salons for NWCCC. Bruce Clifton and I built the current print racks that NWCCC uses for print displays at their conventions.




