Now is a good time to set some goals.

Why did you join Seattle Photographic Society?
Most members join at least in part because they want to improve their photography. We can learn quite a bit from looking at others' images and listening to the comments that are made about them, and by watching training demonstrations. But the most important way that we learn and improve is by participating--by practicing photography.

The beginning of the competition year is a good time to set some goals for your photography or for your participation in SPS. What would you like to get better at this year? For instance, I wanted to get better at creating black and white images, so I set a goal to enter at least one monochrome image at every Print Night that I attended, and I think that my skill has improved as a result of the practice.

Some people decide to concentrate on a particular Category for the competition year. For instance, you could make a goal to enter a particular number of images in the Nature Category or in Altered Reality. You could decide to concentrate on abstract images or on composite images. If most of your photography is of nature, you could set a goal to branch out into other subjects. Other goals that you could set would be to participate in a certain number of Challenges of the Month or to participate in Assignments.

If most of your pictures are taken on trips, you could set a goal to take pictures in your own back yard or in your home. You could decide to learn more about lighting and take some still lifes or some posed portraits. And if you love photography but feel you don't do it as often as you would like to, figure out specific times that you can go out shooting, and put them on your calendar.

What will your photography goals be for this year?
