When and how did you become interested in photography?



When I was 13 I learned that if I joined the Cook County High School photoclub I could hang out in the darkroom during study halls, stand on the sidelines of football and basketball games looking official, and take telephoto shots of cheerleaders. Needless to say, I became an active member.

The club had a Honeywell Spotmatic and an Ashai Spotmatic, a 50mm 1.2, a 55 mm macro, a 135mm telephoto and a contract to supply photos for the yearbook. For an event, we would shoot several rolls, then run off contact sheets for the editors. I really loved working in the darkroom. There is something magic about watching a print come up in the developer tray.





I decided that I had skillz when I went to see an exhibition of Ansell Adams prints at North Dakota State University. It wasn't my command of the zone system, but simply that I did a much better job of spotting dust and scratches than Ansell's professional printers.

When career and life made it too hard to keep a darkroom, I put my cameras away. Digital got me back into photography; it let me have a darkroom without the toxic mess and expense.

What type of photography do you like to do most and why?

At my heart, I'm a "found photographer." I enjoy poking about with my camera hunting for something interesting. I love revisiting people and

Why did you join SPS?


I wanted to meet photographers and I wanted some honest critique of my photos.

August 20 at 7:00 - George Ferrara on Black Light Photography.


